While each of these artists engage with a variety of media ranging from quilting and fiber-based works to painting and found objects, they recently endeavored to collaborate on a series of paintings inspired by the architectural details and spaces at the Willamette Heritage Center located in historic downtown Salem, Oregon. Architecture is imbued with the scents, stains and memories of the



people and activities within, and through their collaboration, Elizabeth and Bonnie push those ideas in unexpected ways.


## Biographies

Elizabeth Bauman graduated from Willamette University with a degree in studio art. Her work is continuously evolving, sometimes circling back, inspired by history, folk art, objects, nature, as well as women's place in this world, both historical and contemporary, environmental concerns, and occasional political or other contemporary topics depicted realistically, abstractly, or both. Elizabeth currently resides and works in Keizer and Salem, Oregon, with her young daughter and husband.

Bonnie Hull is a painter, a preservationist, a gardener, a quilter. She was an Artist in Residence at Bush Barn Art Center in 2010 and again in 2017, and continues to exhibit her work in shows throughout the region. As an active community member in Salem since 1970, Hull was involved in the making of two of Salem's historic districts, co-owned the Arbor Café for 14 years, and has been active on the Bush House Restoration Committee, the Downtown Development Board, the Lord and Schryver Conservancy and other community groups.
